Holy Saturday

Have you ever heard of "Holy Saturday" before? It comes after Maundy Thursday, the day Jesus institutes the Lord's Supper, and after Good Friday, the day Jesus is crucified. Yet, it comes before the Easter Vigil and Easter morning proclamation of the Good News of the risen Christ.

So what is Holy Saturday?

Take yourself back to the original events. Jesus was just crucified and then buried. This man you had spent years following around was suddenly dead. Sure, Jesus occasionally mentioned that He would rise again, but that was confusing parables, right? So you're left to wander aimlessly. A hole has taken place where Jesus was in your heart. Grief, sadness, loneliness, and many other emotions take hold. Death hurts, it is scary, something to be avoided, and it seems so final.

This is Holy Saturday.

It is the space in-between the death of Jesus and the coming Resurrection. It is a time filled with unknowns and painful emotions. Paradoxically, it is easy to get stuck in Holy Saturday, yet also to jump quickly to Easter, avoiding one's feelings.

Yet I see Holy Saturday to be necessary. It speaks to a reality in life we all have, are currently, or will face. The pain and sting of death. The deep emotions that the death of a loved one brings, and the abyss which is easy to get lost in.

Holy Saturday is a very human experience.

Yet, on the horizon is the sun, and with it comes the news proclaimed by women that the tomb is empty and Christ is risen.

My friends, we have hope in the Resurrection of Jesus. God in Christ has "descended to the dead" and rose again. What makes Holy Saturday "Holy"? The promise and realization that you are not alone. That you are *never* alone. It is okay to feel and express emotions. There is no shame in grief or sadness.

God suffers with you. God does not magically take away pain and sorrow but sits with you in your grief instead. This is what the Easter proclamation is all about. Holy Saturday, as difficult and painful as it can be, gives way to Resurrection Joy. It takes time, but there is always hope because God loves you.

We know the end of the story. The grave cannot hold God! Alleluia, Christ has risen!

Church Council Highlights

The following are some highlights from the March 16, 2023 meeting of our church council.

- The Worship Team shared information regarding upcoming Holy Week services Maundy Thursday 6:30pm, Good Friday 6:30pm, Easter Vigil 6:30pm, Easter Sunrise 6am, and Easter Sunday 9am with an Easter Egg Hunt to follow worship. They also reported that Vicar Anthony's "after church Bible study" has been very successful.
- First Communion will be held during worship on Palm Sunday with instruction the day before.
- Youth Huddle reported that Lunch in the Park is set for Friday, July 21st.
- A Call Committee has been appointed by Council. The Call Committee includes Charlie Betz, Sarah Coss, Sue Florschuetz, Karen Goy, Mike Maas, Lisa Martin, Nick Piller, Garret Zinke, and Council reps Melissa Doll and Tony Troyer.
- The Property Team reported that the project manager for stained glass window repair will be here for a walk-through on Monday, March 20th. Work will get started right away. They also reported that the boiler is now repaired with a new part being installed.
- The Council appointed Dennis Bieser to a 3-year term on the Scholarship Committee.
- There was discussion about changing the days/times for Council meetings in May through August to Sunday at 10:15am. This will allow one of the Council members to be able to attend.
- The Council approved joining the Mendota Area Chamber of Commerce.
- The next All Teams Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, April 13, 2023 at 6pm. Dinner will be served as part of the meeting.



can only have 10 people participate out on the highway, but if more people show up on the designated days, we'll clean up other areas, like around the church. Stay tuned for more details including dates & times.


