Church Council Highlights

The following are some highlights from the November 16, 2023 meeting of our church council.

- Rev. Karen Tews attended the meeting as our new Interim Pastor. She will be in the office generally on Thursdays, plans to attend All Teams and Council meetings, and will teach our Confirmation class.
- Council approved the Educational Ministry Team's suggestion that the Sunday School start time be moved to 10:10am beginning on January 7th.
- The Service Team reported that attendance at fellowship after worship has been declining. They propose offering coffee fellowship following worship on the third Sunday of each month.
- Council appointed Troy Holland to fill the vacancy on the Benevolence/Ministry Enhancement Team.
- The Call Committee reported that Candidate #1 (who interviewed, but then withdrew their name from the process) met recently with the Committee to explain that the reasons for their previous withdrawal have been resolved, and that they would like to move forward with St. John's in the Call process. Council approved the Call Committee's recommendation to move forward. A special meeting will be held on Wednesday, November 29th with Assistant to the Bishop, Rev. Jen Beamsley in attendance.
- The next All Teams Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, December 7th at 7pm; and the next Council meeting is scheduled for Thursday, December 21st at 6:30pm.
- The Annual Meeting of St. John's Congregation is set for Sunday, January 28, 2024 (following worship). All teams should have their annual reports turned in to the office by Thursday, January 4, 2024.
