As we enter into the month of February, we look at a month that has only 28 please contact the church days. So much happens in this short month that we often fail to grasp all office. Annual Meeting of St. John's Congregation

The annual meeting was held on Sunday, January 24th at 10:45am via Zoom. Council President Steve Florschuetz opened the meeting with remarks about all of the good that God has provided us this past year including our interim clergy and youth director, call committee, church council, staff, musicians, and the volunteers who make our ministry possible. Pastor Ken Gibson led the opening devotion, and thanked the congregation for the warm welcome that he, Yvonne, and Bob have received. They are very happy to be here with us.

Carol Wheeler presented the Treasurer's Report noting that we did spend more than we took in, but despite the effects of the pandemic and added expenses for updating the parsonage and pastor's moving, we ended the year better than expected. The congregation approved the 2021 Annual Budget which also included possible stained glass window repairs that could exceed \$10,000.

All of the Team reports, the 2021 Ballot, and the Benevolence/Ministry Enhancement distribution were approved.
