

Annual Meeting of St. John's Congregation

The 166th Annual Meeting of St. John's Congregation was held in the Fellowship Hall following worship on Sunday, January 28th. Council President Ken Ladenburger called the meeting to order and after determining that there was a quorum, Pastor Elise Rothfusz led the opening devotion. A video message from Bishop Stacie Fidlar was shown.

Council President Ken Ladenburger shared remarks about 2023: the retirement of Pastor Ken Gibson, Vicar Anthony Windau becoming our Interim Pastor until mid-August, the many pulpit supply pastors we were privileged to meet, and our Interim Pastor Karen Tews leading us up to the arrival of Pastor Elise Rothfusz. He expressed our gratitude for the members of the Transition Team and the Call Committee, as well as the dedicated staff and many volunteers who made it possible for us to continue all of our ministries and activities during the Call process. He thanked everyone who contributed the funds to repair our beautiful stained glass windows. Ken also thanked his fellow outgoing Council member Dorothy Brandner for her years of service to the church. Fun fact: Did you know that in our 166 years we have had 24 full time senior pastors?

Treasurer Jeff Simonton presented the 2023 Treasurer's Report which was approved. He noted that this is the first time in a long time that we ended the year "in the black." This was due to not having a full-time pastor. He then presented the 2024 Annual Budget which was also approved by the congregation.

All of the Team reports were approved. The 2024 Ballot was presented and voted upon favorably. We need an additional Synod Delegate. If you are interested, please contact the office.

Todd Zimmerlein presented the Benevolence/Ministry Enhancement Distribution for 2024 which was approved. Todd also thanked outgoing Council President, Ken Ladenburger, for his two terms on Council.

New Business — Thank you to Todd Zimmerlein and family for installing the new huge tv monitor in the Sanctuary. There is another monitor yet to be installed. The next annual meeting is scheduled for Sunday, January 26, 2025.

It was noted that Pastor Elise's birthday was on January 23rd — "Happy Birthday" was sung by all!

We hope you'll invite your family and friends to join you in allowing our St. John's Youth and Youth Huddle members to serve you a plate of warm pancakes, grilled sausage patties, and applesauce in a bright, festive room with others as we prepare to enter into our Lenten journeys. Feel free to dine in or carry dinner out. Meals will be offered to anyone for a freewill donation of any amount.

New this year — We will be collecting items to be donated to the Micropantry located at the First Presbyterian Church. Everyone is invited to participate as you choose. The Micropantry ministry offers families in need the ability to access food and other items, at any time of the day, for no cost. This ministry serves a great number of people in our community. Items that are in high demand at the Micropantry include: canned meats (such as tuna and chicken); Lunchables; peanut butter; jelly; granola bars; pasta sauce and pasta; oatmeal packets; individually packaged fruit cups or applesauce; canned veggies (including black beans and chickpeas); packets of snack crackers (cheese, peanut butter, etc.); saltine crackers (they put these out instead of bread). The Micropantry does have coolers so they can also accept items such as milk and cheeses that need refrigeration. They will also accept baby formula, paper products (toilet paper, Kleenex), and personal care items.

All proceeds from our Pancake Supper will be tithed to a ministry voted upon by the youth. The remainder will be used to fund future youth mission projects, ministries, and mission trip opportunities. If you'd like to donate items to serve at the event (pancake mix, applesauce, milk, etc.), please see the sign-up sheets on the Information Booth in the Fellowship Hall or contact the church office.
