The following are some highlights from the May 19, 2022 meeting of our church council (conducted via Zoom).

- Council will continue to review Covid-19 safety measures and make adjustments to our guidelines as needed. Due to an uptick in Covid positivity numbers, we will return to communion being offered "in the pews" using the communion baggies for the time being.
- The Task Force reported that \$4,000 was donated to the Ukraine Match Fund. Additionally, they will be working along with the Outreach Team to assemble Care Kits on Saturday, July 23rd. More information will be shared with the congregation about how they can help.
- Council approved entering a float in this year's Sweet Corn Festival parade on Sunday, August 14th.
- The next All Teams Meeting is set for Thursday, June 2nd at 7pm. The next Council meeting will take place on Thursday, June 16th at 6:30pm.


