Message from Steve Florschuetz, Council President, to St. John's Congregation — February 16, 2018

I really love being a part of this congregation. Very few people have been members here longer than I have, so I have seen my share of changes over the years. Fellow members of the Church Council see this time in our history as very challenging and very exciting at the same time.

Recently, on the morning of the Annual Meeting, some comments were made during the service that seemed both harsh and confusing. We, as a Council are concerned about any hurts or misunderstandings that this may have caused. We are your Church Council not above any of you, but actually we are your servants. The people who have just left the Council were outstanding examples of how servants work in our midst and we thank them again for their service. Yes, you could come and observe how we operate any time, but not participate unless you have asked to be on the agenda for that particular meeting.

> This past fall, when the whole congregation was asked for their opinions on several issues, we got a huge response. We heard both positive and negative comments. You need to know that your voices were heard. We don't take those responses lightly. We are sad to see Pastor Janet leave, but we are also looking forward with great anticipation to what God has in store for St. John's. It is really His church anyway isn't it?

> Looking forward, it is apparent that some people love the traditional service with our fantastic organ accompanying and playing the music. Many other people love the Praise type service which is a lot less formal. We never should have gotten away from the two separate services, and it has cost us in fewer people worshiping each week. That is why the previous Council voted to go back to the two separate and very different services. This change will begin happening on Sunday, March 4, but this will happen as it does in the summer with every other Sunday being different with still one service. We are also gearing toward the fall to implement both services on Sunday mornings, much the same as it used to be. We are also looking at the possibility of having an interim youth director to fill in until we can get a full time pastor, and full time youth director. The future is bright. Talk to us if you feel the need, and we will try to do the same with you.
