> The ring around the arms of the Cross is a very Celtic symbol, dating back, likely, to the 6th century. It symbolizes eternity, as a circle is without a beginning or end. The Cross in the center represents God's eternity and Jesus' death (and resurrection) being for all times. It is a simple but beautiful cross. I wonder why the members of St. John's back in the 1930s decided to adorn the top of our building.

Maybe it was meant to symbolize the world, and the Cross as a way to say God in Christ Jesus died for all people. Perhaps as a reminder that God is, was, and always will be. Or, maybe the stonemason just liked the shape of it!

Regardless, in the simple beauty, I am reminded of God's love for all people and creation. I invite you to look closely at the various kinds of art around St. John's. There's beautiful masonry, woodwork, and of course, stained glass. While the church is far more than the physical building, our space tells stories of our past; it reminds us that St. John's has been around for a long time and has overcome a lot. It teaches us about God-through the stories in the stained-glass, symbols adorning the chancel, and various designs on the outside. The physical space and artwork also shows that we can appreciate God in many and various ways. What's your favorite artwork at St. John's?
