We are excited to announce that St. John's Lutheran Church is registered for a Feed My Starving Children MobilePack event! A reservation for 70 volunteers has been made. We will be joined by approximately 20 youth and adults from a Leo club in Paw Paw. One of their club members, Samantha Katschke, is also a Sunday school student here at St. John's. The Leo club is a group of young people learning about the value of volunteering.

The date for the MobilePack is Saturday, December 5, 2015 from 12pm (noon) to 2pm. The MobilePack will take place at Calvary Baptist Church, 1017 N. School Street, Normal, Illinois. This church is located 2-3 blocks east of Highway 51 shortly after exiting I-39 at Bloomington.

Please contact the church office at (815) 539-5626 or Shirley Pierson at (815) 539-7160 if you are interested in volunteering. A first and last name is required along with whether the volunteer is an adult or a youth under the age of 18. The minimum age for volunteering is five. Kindergarten through 2nd graders require an adult for each child, 3rd through 6th graders need one adult per three students, 7th through 9th graders need one adult per four students, and 10th through 12th graders need one adult per five students. There should be enough adults participating that we can help cover these requirements. We hope that you will prayerfully consider joining us in packing food for starving children throughout the world.

5 Things That Happen When You Get A New Pastor

So let's imagine that your parish has just said goodbye to a pastor, even one who is dearly beloved, and has now welcomed someone new. She's in, she's had her first Sunday, and now you're wondering, "What's next?" Based on my experience, here are five things that happen when a new pastor arrives:

- 1. New people show up.
- 2. Some people will leave.
- 3. Worship will change.
- 4. New life will spring forth.
- 5. You will love each other, by God.

If gossip, hard hearts, unrelenting egos and ambition get in the way, this fruit of the new relationship will surely whither on the vine. But when we give each other the authority and space to welcome new people, let people go, embrace godly change and encourage new life, love will grow and flourish and infect the church like a mustard seed, allowing the gospel to take root.
