

The following are some highlights from the October 15, 2020 Church Council meeting.

- It was reported that the Task Force donated \$5,000 of their funds to Lutheran Disaster Relief for the wildfires out west.
- Council approved opening the Sanctuary for funeral services as long as our current guidelines regarding social distancing and mask wearing are followed.
- Confirmation Classes will resume following worship on Sunday, November 1st. All other Sunday School classes remain on hold.
- Beginning November 1st, we will resume Communion during worship. Disposable, pre-filled units will be used.
- The Installation Service for Pastor Ken will be held on Sunday. December 6th.


