It takes many hands — working together — to accomplish all that takes place in a church like St. John's Lutheran Church. Some of those "hands" are highly visible as they lead worship services, usher, teach Sunday school classes, or participate in musical presentations. Others are not seen as much as they labor behind the scenes cleaning the building, serving on committees, or in many other ways.

That is true of all types of organizations, but what sets the church apart — especially a church like St. John's — is that we are not just working by ourselves and for ourselves. We are working together hand in hand with Almighty God. As Annie Johnson Flint wrote, "Christ has no hands but our hands to do His work today."

What we are doing, whether it is one of the highly visible functions or one of the behind-the-scenes tasks, we are doing for God's glory. We are "God's fellow servants." We are truly working together with God! And as we do so, we have the opportunity to celebrate God's good gifts to us.

As God's children, sometimes our emphasis is on things like food, clothing, shelter, crops, and a land which brings forth His bounty in abundance. As we benefit from God's good gifts like these and many others, our response should be one of thanksgiving and gratitude to Him.

But God's good gifts are also spiritual in nature. For example, God gave the gift of His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, to be our Savior. Without doubt, this is the greatest gift of all! God gives the gift of faith so that people can trust Christ for salvation. God gives the gift of grace, which is an expression of His unconditional love towards us. God gives the gift of wisdom to those who ask Him. God gives the Holy Spirit to us to help us in our Christian lives and in our praying. God gives spiritual gifts which enable us to serve Him and to minister to others. He even provides as special gifts the people who work in His kingdom as pastors, teachers, and missionaries.

Perhaps the gifts of God are best summarized in James 1:17. Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. Think about it: Every good gift is from God. All He requires of us, His children, is that we diligently follow Him with the full expectation and confidence that He will reward our faithful obedience. Obedience has been defined as doing what God says, when God says, with the right heart attitude. A spirit of willing obedience is essential as we seek to use the time, talents and treasure that God has entrusted to us for God's glory and for the good of other people. So is a willingness to listen to God.

2 Max Lucado wrote, "Once there was a man who dared God to speak. 'Burn the bush like you did for Moses, God, and I will follow. Collapse the walls like you did for Joshua, God, and I will follow. Still the waves like you did on Galilee, God, and I will follow."

And so the man sat by a bush, near a wall, close to the sea, and waited for God to speak. And God heard the man, so God answered. He sent a fire, not for a bush, but for a church. He brought down a wall, not of brick, but of sin. He stilled a storm, not

But because the man was looking at bushes, not hearts, bricks, and not lives, seas, and not souls, he decided that God had done nothing. Finally, he looked to God and asked, "Have you lost your power?" And God looked at him and said, "Have you lost your hearing?"

What is your response to God's good gifts? As one who is "working together" with God and listening to God, will you make a fresh commitment to use the time, talents and treasure you have received from Him in an even greater way in 2024?

Church Council Highlights

The following are some highlights from the October 19, 2023 meeting of our church council.

- We should have some information on a possible Part-time Interim Pastor within the next few weeks. The office has Pulpit Supply scheduled through the end of the year and will adjust this as needed. James Younger continues to coordinate the worship services with our musicians and the visiting pastors.
- The Stewardship Team stated that the four lay speakers have been scheduled for the 2023 Stewardship Campaign, "Working Together Celebrating God's Good Gifts."
- The Youth Huddle shared that the high school group is planning a bonfire/get together on Saturday, October 28th from 6:30pm to 9pm in the courtyard. They also announced that the Spaghetti Dinner will be held on Sunday, December 3rd. Information will be shared with the congregation as the date approaches.
- The Outreach Team announced that the quilting group boxed 79 quilts and 6 school kits for Lutheran World Relief. Everything was delivered to Rockford on October 8th.
- The Call Committee said Candidate #1 was interviewed, but then withdrew their name from the process. The Candidate was highly complimentary of the Call Committee and cited "other reasons" for their decision to withdraw.
- Regarding Christmas Eve Worship We plan to have one blended service on December 24th at 4:30pm. This will work out best for our scheduled Pulpit Supply pastor who will also preside at 9am worship that day (4th Sunday of Advent). We will not be holding midweek Advent services this year.
- The next All Teams Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, November 2nd at 7pm; and the next Council meeting is scheduled for Thursday, November 16th at 6:30pm.
